Attached are a couple of draft grids for contemplation. These are only meant as examples to start the flow of ideas.

Sentencing Reform Act Review - Sentencing Grid Option #1

This draft grid is the Option #1 grid from the SGC report. Some of the cells have been merged, like in the drug grid, and some have not. During the Criminal Sentencing Task Force – Sentencing Effectiveness work group meeting, Lauren from WSIPP mentioned a state had a grid that allowed wide discretion on less serious offenses and narrower discretion for the more severe sentences. That is what this draft was supposed to emulate. Where cells stopped merging is entirely arbitrary.

Non-Violent Offense Sentencing Grid

This draft grid is the current standard grid with merged cells like in the drug grid (keeping the separation between jail/prison cells in tact) that could be used as a Non-violent Offense Sentencing Grid. Since the creation of the SRA, the notion of a non-violent offense grid has been floated around. Sentences where a non-violent offense is the most serious offense, which includes property offenses, is the biggest bulk of annual convictions. In FY19, there was a total of 24,257 convictions. Of those, 22,172 were for non-violent offenses. After removing sex offenses and offenses that are on the drug grid, that left 14,425. That's still 60% of all the convictions for that year.

In setting up the non-violent sentencing grid, the standard ranges were not changed, only merged. No changes were made to any cells where an Offender Score = 0 as it was thought that those might be good candidates for confinement alternatives. The red numbers within the cells represent the total number of sentences for FY19 that were in any of the cells that were merged, based on the most serious offense.

Another consideration would be the creation of a 'finding' of a behavioral health issue that is related to the crime that can be used to employ a confinement alternative. This would allow the confinement alternative be based on the cases circumstances and not unilaterally issued to any individual, regardless of the crime or the circumstance, that ends up in a particular grid cell (thinking: Offender Score = 0).
