a. SB 5227 Concerning offenses involving child sex dolls. The SGC has been asked to provide recommended rankings for the new offenses.

- g. HB 1484/SB 5366 Concerning exceptional sentences for offenses which result in the pregnancy of a victim of rape.
- h. HB 1487/SB 5362 Concerning victims of crime act funding.

- r. SB 5071 Updating the endangerment with a controlled substance statute.
- s. SB 5219 Concerning partial confinement eligibility and alignment.
- t. SB 5268 Classifying unlawful possession of a firearm as a violent offense.
- u. SB 5323 Concerning the penalties for theft and possession of stolen property from first responders.
